






Our Services



Child Protection Week runs occurs every September and serves as a powerful reminder that the safety and wellbeing of children and young people are paramount.

In support of National Child Protection Week, the School, Students and Families Program (SSFP) and seven schools in the Diocese facilitated an hour long parent information sessions aimed at providing psycho-social education to parents and carers.

These sessions were designed to enhance protective factors and are aligned with our program logic focused on developing resilience. The workshops also connected with the 2023 Child Protection week theme, "Where We Start Matters", emphasising the importance of early intervention and support in child development.

The information sessions covered a range of topics including:

- Managing Big Emotions
- Building a Child's Resilience
- Support Children in Developing Friendships • 178 parents/carers registered to attend a range
- of workshops
- Overall satisfaction rating 9/10

Technology Improvements.

CatholicCare has been conducting an IT Transformation Program to upgrade our IT infrastructure and application. The upgrades have resulted in increased efficiencies, lower technology costs, improved service delivery which has resulted in improved client experiences and increased client satisfaction.

The activities in the 2023-24 financial year were focussed on our infrastructure, applications, security and compliance requirements to ensure we continue to meet the needs of the agency and maintain the confidentiality of our client's data.

The ICT team also developed and delivered a number of major Client Management Information Systems (CMIS) projects, including implementing Penelope for School, Student and Families Program and Permanency Support Program teams, as well as being in the first

stages of Penelope implementation for FCP and Contact. ICT also successfully implemented CareLink GO via a pilot program with 10 Community Support Workers (CSW), which will continue to roll out to all CSWs.







Key Snapshots.

The current challenging financial climate has had an impact on the bottom line of some programs, particularly Aged Care and NDIS. Government funding has not kept pace with inflation and the rising cost of living.

We achieved a modest **net surplus of \$1,056,000**, maintaining financial health while expanding our services and reach. This surplus represents a **9% improvement** from FY2023, positioning CatholicCare for sustained growth.



Family Services Disability Services Other

Our expenses rose by 8% (\$2.65 million), largely driven by increased staffing needs. Salary expenses grew by **11% (\$2 million),** reflecting our focus on attracting and retaining a skilled workforce to meet growing service demand.
